## Graded 5 – Writing Instructions

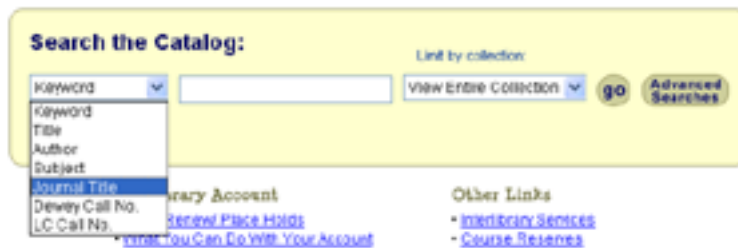
How to find the following article in the SJSU system:

Drabenstott, K. M. (2004, Winter). Why I still teach online searching. *Journal of Education for Library and Information Science*, 45(1), 75-80.

1. Double click on the Internet Explorer icon.
2. In the address bar, type <http://www.sjlibrary.org/> and hit enter.
3. In the left hand frame, click the link entitled "Library Catalog."



4. Under "search the catalog," from the pull-down menu on the right select "Journal Title."



5. In the adjacent text box, type "*Journal of Education for Library and Information Science*" and then click "go."

6. Two records will appear. Look in the "format" column for the picture of the computer and CD-ROM. This indicates the journal is available electronically.

7. Click on the journal title of the record for the electronic resource.

8. On the next page, you should see the title and publisher information:

To the left of the article title, you should see three small, square icons.

Click the first to access the article on the web in HTML format (basically text-only).

Click the second to see the article in .pdf format (as it appeared in the printed journal).

Once the article is open, you can print or save it.
